## **Director, Office of Emergency Management**

Toronto is Canada's largest city, the fourth largest in North America, and home to a diverse population of about 2.8 million people. Toronto's Emergency Services is composed of four service providers: Fire Services, Paramedic Services, Police Services, Office of Emergency Management. Although each provider handles specific types of public safety and emergencies, they all provide assistance in times of need.

Reporting to the Toronto Fire Chief, the Director will provide leadership and direction in emergency management, business continuity, and emergency social service issues and activities through initiation and implementation of corporate emergency management and business continuity programs. The Director will provide the necessary vision and context throughout the whole of Toronto's public service in order to promote a level of operational emergency preparedness in co-operation with internal and external stakeholders, emergency services, public and private sector partners and service providers, and other levels of government.

You bring extensive senior level management experience in emergency management in key areas of mitigation, preparedness, response, business continuity planning and the implementation of all aspects of an incident management system (IMS). You have excellent strategic and problem-solving skills and are familiar with the emergency management principles and theory including the five phases of response. Able to inspire confidence, you have experience as a results-oriented leader, with the capacity to effectively plan, develop, implement policies and special projects in high stress situations requiring a fast turnaround.
