

Four Main Steps in Collecting and Releasing Starts Data



- 1. Monthly building permit reports collected from municipalities
- 2. Permits for **new residential construction, conversions** and demolitions reviewed and entered into our database for tracking
- 3. Field enumerators receive permits to track and visit construction sites, recording starts (new construction only), completions & absorption information
- 4. Monthly data released on the 11th working day of the next month

Conversion = Net Gain or Loss of Homes on an Existing Foundation





- 1. Non-residential structure converted to residential structure
- 2. Existing residential structure has units added using only existing foundation (secondary unit*)
- 3. New house built on an existing foundation.
- 4. Existing residential structure has units reconstructed resulting in fewer units, on an existing foundation.
- 5. Residential structure converted to non-residential structure.
- 6. Existing residential unit(s) within an existing mixedstructure removed or converted to non-residential space.

New Construction Start = New Foundation 100% Complete



















Dwellings without their own entrance, kitchen and bathroom
(nursing homes*, student housing*, hostels)

- Dwellings not permanently attached to a site (mobile homes)



- Dwellings unsuitable for year-round occupancy (summer cottages)


