


The Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario

Established in 1998, the AGCO is an **Ontario provincial regulatory agency** reporting to the **Ministry of the Attorney General** (MAG).


The agency is composed of approximately 630 staff, including 150 staff from the **Ontario Provincial Police** (OPP).

The AGCO's mandate is to regulate the alcohol, cannabis, gaming and horse racing sectors in accordance with the principles of honesty and integrity, and in the public interest.

Types of Licenses & Authorizations

Retail Operator Licence For people/organizations who will be operating cannabis retail stores **Retail Store Authorization** The authorization to operate a physical storefront. Each retail store must have its own authorization.

Manager Licence

For the people who have management responsibilities to ensure the responsible sale of cannabis



Licensing and Training Status



24 cannabis retail stores have been issued Retail Operator Licences and Retail Store Authorizations and are currently open



72 Retail Manager Licences have been issued



Over **1,400** individuals have completed the **CannSell retail training** program, which is required for all employees of cannabis retail stores

A Cannabis Retail Store Authorization may be issued to an applicant unless the Registrar finds it is not in the public interest, as set out in the regulation made under the Cannabis Licence Act, 2018

Preventing Illicit Activities in Relation to Cannabis

- Municipalities have submitted 16 of 168 submissions as part of the public notice process for proposed cannabis retail stores
 - Average of 7.4 submissions received during the public notice process for each proposed cannabis retail store

Local Partnerships

- The AGCO continues to look for opportunities to partner with municipal organizations, including
 - Shared planning with our police partners in preparation for the opening of cannabis retail stores
 - Ongoing information sharing with police partners on matters of common interest
 - Continued engagement with public health units on matters related to the Smoke Free Ontario Act
 - Notification to municipalities of proposed cannabis retail location
