- Most are funded by the Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care

## Public Education Initiatives

Federal Budget 2018

\$62.5 million over 5 years

#### Revenue

- **Projected \$ 400 Million in tax revenue**
- 75% of tax revenues to provinces/territories
- Federal tax revenues capped at \$100 million



## Ontario Liberal Budget 2018 Cannabis Revenue Projections

\$215 million/year by 2021

(Portion of Federal Taxes+ Ontario Cannabis Retail Corporation)



Ontario has not yet announced any investment in public education and treatment linked to expected cannabis revenue
