#### 2022 JOINT ANNUAL MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING STATEMENT

We are pleased to present the annual joint statement for the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Association of Municipalities of Ontario (AMO) and the Province of Ontario for 2022.

Remarkable work was done this year on a variety of initiatives at both the municipal and provincial level. The AMO MOU table continues to be a key platform in helping to support critical discussions on issues of mutual interest and concern, as we work together to help rebuild Ontario.

The MOU table enables the opportunity for the diverse perspectives of Ontario's municipal sector to be considered as part of the government's decision-making process. It is valuable in helping to shape better public policy outcomes for Ontario's communities and residents.

This annual statement provides an update of some of our activities and accomplishments under the MOU during 2022.

#### HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE YEAR
